

Hampshire (including the Isle of Wight), Wiltshire, Dorsetshire—At Salisbury, on the 26th and 27th April 1813.

Somersetshire—At Taunton, on the 26th and 27th April 1813.

Devonshire—At Exeter, on the 29th and 30th April 1813.

Cornwall—At Plymouth, on the 29th and 30th April 1813.

His Royal Highness is at the same time graciously pleased to declare, that the said Private Men who upon examination, shall be found fit for service, shall receive the sum of one shilling and four-pence per diem each, from the time of their leaving their respective homes, until their arrival at the examining station, calculating the same at the rate of ten miles for a day's march; and be afterwards subsisted until allotted to a Veteran Battalion, at the rate of one shilling per diem for pay, and one penny per diem for beer money.

His Royal Highness is also pleased to order, that every man found fit for duty shall, on his joining the Veteran Battalion to which he shall be appointed, receive a bounty of one pound five shillings, or so much thereof as shall remain after supplying him with proper necessaries; and it is His Royal Highness's gracious intention, that every such man whose pension is now less than nine-pence per diem, shall be entitled, when discharged, to that increased rate of Out-Pension, provided he be recommended by his Colonel or Commanding Officer as an object deserving of His Majesty's royal bounty.

It is His Royal Highness's further pleasure, that the men who, upon examination shall be found unfit for any duty shall be dismissed, and be settled with at the rate of one shilling and four-pence per diem each, from the time of their leaving their respective homes, until their arrival at the examining stations, calculating the same at the rate of ten miles for a day's march; receiving also the like allowance to carry them back to their homes; and that while detained for examination, they shall receive pay and beer money, as above.

And it is hereby notified, that all Out-Pensioners in South Britain, hereby called upon to attend, who shall not appear at the times and places herein appointed, will be considered as otherwise provided for by Government, or as dead, and will accordingly be struck off the books of the Out-Pension of the said Hospital, without any prospect of being restored thereto.

**T**HESE are, by Order of the Right Honourable the Lords and others, Commissioners for managing the Affairs of the Royal Hospital at Chelsea, to give notice, that His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to command that all Out-Pensioners belonging to the said Hospital, resident in London, or within twenty-five miles thereof, who have been discharged from their regi-

ments as private men, as well from the Cavalry, Foot Guards, and Infantry of the Line, as from the Militia and Fencibles, the Out-Pensioners from the late Horse Guards, and Horse Grenadier Guards, the Life Guards, and Royal Regiment of Horse Guards, such men as by the Hospital Books are now more than fifty-five years of age, or had served twenty-four years in the Cavalry, or twenty-one years in the Infantry, previously to their discharges, those who have lost a limb, or their eye sight, or are cripples, or who received a certificate of their total unfitness for farther service, from any of the Officers employed at the general examination of Out-Pensioners in the year 1805, those who are at present in the receipt of a pension, exceeding one shilling per diem, or those actually serving in the embodied Militia, excepted, do personally and regimentally appear with their instructions, and certificates of admission, at the said Hospital on the respective days undermentioned and appointed for them, according to their several rates of pension, when and where attendance will be given from Nine o'Clock in the Morning till Three in the Afternoon, in order that such of them as on examination shall be fit, may be sent to a Veteran Battalion, viz.—

*On Friday, the 9th of April,*

The Pensioners at sixpence per day, from the 1st Regiment of Dragoon Guards to the 7th Dragoon Guards. Those from the 1st Regiment of Dragoons with the remaining Regiments of Cavalry. Those from the Foot Guards, 1st Regiment of Foot, to the 50th inclusive.

*On Saturday, the 10th of April,*

Those at sixpence per day, from the 57th Regiment of Foot, and all the remaining Regiments or Corps; also the Pensioners at ninepence per day, from the 1st Regiment of Dragoon Guards, with those from the several Regiments of Cavalry.

*On Monday, the 12th of April,*

Those at ninepence per day, from the Foot Guards and the 1st Regiment of Foot Guards, to the 83d inclusive.

*On Tuesday, the 13th of April,*

Those at ninepence per day, from the 84th Regiment of Foot, and all the remaining Regiments or Corps; those at one shilling per day, from the 1st Regiment of Dragoon Guards, with all those from the several Regiments of Cavalry, as likewise the Pensioners from the 1st and Coldstream Regiments of Guards.

*On Wednesday, the 14th of April,*

Those at one shilling per day, from the 3d Regiment of Foot Guards, with those from the 1st Regiment of Foot to the 64th inclusive.

*On Thursday, the 15th of April,*

Those at one shilling per day, from the 65th Regiment of Foot, and all the remaining Regiments and Corps, with those of the several Regiments of Militia at fivepence per day.
