

service, shall be considered as entitled to pay from the respective days of their appearance, in pursuance of this order, and that none shall be required to serve in any other corps than a Veteran Battalion, and that every man found fit for duty, shall, on his joining the Battalion to which he shall be appointed, receive a Bounty of one pound five shillings, or so much thereof as shall remain, after supplying him with proper necessaries: and that those who, on examination, are found unfit for duty, shall be dismissed with proportionate subsistence to carry them back to their homes, estimating the same from the time of their leaving their places of residence.

His Royal Highness is farther pleased to declare, that every Private Out-Pensioner received in conformity to this order into a Veteran Battalion, whose Out Pension is at present under ninepence per day, shall be entitled, when discharged therefrom, to have his Pension increased to that rate, provided he be recommended by his Colonel, or Commanding Officer, as deserving of His Majesty's Royal Bounty.

And it is hereby notified, that all the Private Out-Pensioners resident in London, or within twenty-five miles thereof, discharged as aforesaid, (except as before excepted): who shall not appear, and be examined at the times herein appointed, will be considered as otherwise provided for by Government, or as dead, and they will accordingly be struck off the Books of the Out Pension of the said Hospital.
