Belle Poule, at Sea, April 4, 1813. HAVE much satisfaction in reporting, that I yesterday, after a chase of nine hours, captured the Grand Napoleon, the largest and most esteemed schooner that has sailed from America; twenty-nine days from New York, bound to Bourdeaux, with a valuable cargo on board, is a new vessel, measuring three hundred and five tons, pierced for twenty-two guns, mounting only four, has a complement of thirty-two men, is copperfastened, and in every respect one of the finest vessels I ever saw.
