By virtue of the authority in me vested, and in conformity with an ordinance of the 23d May, and an edict of the 13th August 1800, I do hereby make known, that, in compliance with a petition delivered in, I have permitted and granted that the Honourable Dealing Court for the jurisdiction of Christianstad, in this island, as administering the estate of the deceased Hans Jeger, Merchant, and his likewise deceased wife Marie-Catherine Jeger, may summon by proclama sub-pena praelusi et perpetui silentii, all the known or unknown Creditors to the said Hans and Marie C. Jeger's estate, residing in European or American territories, to come forward with their demands, and to enter and prove their claims, in person or by their attorneys, before the said Dealing Court, previous to the expiration of the period herein-after limited, that is to say, within one year and six weeks from the period when this proclama shall have been recorded
