The contract to commence as soon as possible after the lowest offers can be ascertained. Persons who are disposed to make tenders, are to understand that, notwithstanding provision is made in the schedule to be delivered, for a rate of pay for carpenters employed by the day, and also for such materials as may be supposed to be required on the same principle, yet it is intended, this mode should apply chiefly to such services as may, in some degree, be connected with the performance of works by admittance, or in the event of any emergency which may justify employing the contractor on this footing.

It is further to be understood, that the contract is intended to apply only to new work, or such other very general repairs as the Board, or the Commanding Royal Engineer may deem expedient to be performed by the contractor.

Proposals for the performance of the work in the Portsmouth division will be received either for the whole of the carpenter's and joiner's work which may be required in the division, or separately for the works on the Portsmouth and Gosport sides.

Printed schedules of the contract will be delivered to such persons who may apply for them at the Office of the Secretary to the Board, in Pall-Mall, between the hours of ten and four o'clock; and also at the Offices of the Commanding Royal Engineer at Portsmouth, Plymouth, and Chatham.

Payment to be made within three months next after the quarter in which the certificate of the performance of the work, or the delivery of the articles, shall be lodged in the Office of the Surveyor-General at the Tower; or in default thereof, an interest, after the rate of 5l. per cent. per annum, will be allowed.

The proposals are to be delivered at the Office of the Secretary to the Board, in Pall-Mall; sealed up, and endorsed "Proposals for the Performance of the Carpenter's and Joiner's Works, either in the Portsmouth, Plymouth, or Medway Divisions, whichever Division the Parties may tender for;" and it is to be understood, that no proposal will be admitted after the said 9th day of July, at twelve o'clock at noon of the same day.
