And to have for Fault, Ammitted, and Line all and Jundry his Lands, Heretages, Liffrents, and Rents, Offices, Tieles and Dignitics, Tackes, Steadings, Rooms, Poniefficus, Goods, and Gar whatlocver perposing to him, to our socycteign Lord to remain percecual projects his Highness Property, which was pronounced for doom. Speech of Lyon King at Arms, at the tearing of the Arms of the late, Earl of Argille, after the pronouncing of his Sentence of Forfaulter.

Forasmuch as Atchibild Earl of Argile, is by a Sentence of the Lords Commissioners of Justiciary, found Guilty of the Crimes of Treasin, Leasing making, and Leasing telling, and Decorned so be Execute as a Traitor, Forfulted in his Estate, and his Name, Memory, and Honors to be extent, and his Mame, Memory, and Honors to be extent, and his Arms to be Riven forth and Belate out of the Books of Arms, Therefore I, Hu Majestis tyon King at Arms, in His Mujesties Name, and Authority, do now Tedt, Caricel, Reverse, und Trample under-foot the Arms of the said lake Earl of Atgile, with all the Budges, and Ornaments thereto belonging, and raze the same out of all the publick Registers and Records, and Declare the faid Archibald, late Earl of Argile, as being a Traitor, and six Descendants to be signoble, and unworthy to bear mams, or any Token, of Longs for ever.

Ratisborne, Dec. 26. The 20th Instant the States of the Empire Assembled here, came to a final Regiolution, upon the five Points, concerning the security of the Empire, which have been so long the subject of their Debates. First, That the Circles shall not be at liberty to recall the Troops which they furnish to the Army of the Empire, but that they shall remain there till it be resolved by the States of the Empire to separate the laid Army, secondly, That the Marches, Counter-Marches, Quarterings, and Incampments, shall be with the Advice of the Directors of the Circles, and the States therein interested. Thirds, That the Moneys railed by the Empire for the service of the Army, shall be disposed on and distributed by the General. Fourthly, That the General-Officers, and the Officers of the Artillery shall be paid out of the said Moneys, and such persons as essentially paraged that effectual case manufactuals to regular the Moneys furtant, as well in the Empire, fastin the Heredicary Countreys. These Resolutions to acquaint the Emperor with, this they may have his approbation.

Cologne, Decemb. 31. The French have-not only pulled a themselves of the Countrey of Condrose, which lies on both sides the Meuse, and reaches from Huy as fat as Liege, as Dependence of the Countrey of Ciermons, but have likewise formed Pretensions, on several other places, and particularly on Wans and Lonoin, bulonging to the Archhishoprick of Trier. From Trasbourg we have an Account that the new Fortifications which the French make there, are very much advanced; that the Sieur de Kauban, the Principal Ingenier, was gone for stalk; and that the French continue to provide gicut Magazines at Colmara Schieffalt, Brise, &c., and that they swell about thysking a Bridge over the River as Atmingen.

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
