ISPATCHES from Captain Farguhar commanding His Majesty's naval forces in the Elbe and Weser, addressed to Mr. Croker, annonnce that on the 23d ultimo, the French garrison of Carlsburg, (Bremerlehe) consisting of two hundred and thirty-six officers and men, with thirteen pieces of heavy ordnance, surrendered themselves prisoners of war to the combined British and Russian forces; the latter commanded by Colonel de Radinger, and that on the 24th ult. the garrison of Blexen also surrendered prisoners of war to the same forces. The officers of this garrison are to be sent to France on parole, not to serve against the allies for one year.
