

Christ's-Hospital, December 1, 1813.

WHEREAS John West, late of London, scrivener, and Frances, his wife, both deceased, did in their several life-times, settle on the Governors of the said Hospital, divers estates in and about the City of London, and elsewhere; and the said Frances West, did also give by her will, a sum of money to the said Governors, to be laid out in the purchase of lands, &c.; the profits of the whole of the said estates, to be applied for the payment of annuities or pensions, of five pounds each, to poor men and poor women, of the age of fifty years, and upwards, during their natural lives; and directed that their relations by consanguinity, should have the preference; the said Governors do, therefore, hereby give notice, that if any person, qualified as aforesaid, shall stand in need or desire the benefit of the said charity, they may, within forty days from the date hereof, apply to the said Governors, at the counting-house in the said Hospital, and make out their relationship to the donors, or either of them; otherwise they will be excluded the said charity.

A committee will sit in the counting-house of the said Hospital, on Wednesday the 12th January, 1814, at 11 o'clock in the forenoon, to elect pensioners, in the room of such as are dead.
