BY virtue of the authority in me vested, and in conformity with an ordinance of the 23d May, and an edict of the 12th of August 1800, I do hereby make known, that, in compliance with a petition delivered in, I have permitted and granted, that the Executors of the deceased Alexander Tower, of Aberdeen, in Scotland, Messrs.
