Summons by Edict.

**B**Y virtue of an appointment from the Honourable Court of Civil Justice of this colony, granted upon a petition presented by Thomas Fryer Lagfield and Robert Douglas, as curators to the estate of John Ross, deceased, and of James Sinclair, as curator to the estate of John Sinclair, deceased, under date of 29th January 1814.
