GIOR vitterligt, At jeg, i Kraft i den mig overdragnede Myndighed, og i Overeenstemmelse med en Forordning af 23de May, saat en Placat af 12te August 1800, haver efter derom indkommen Anstigning, tilladt og bevilget, at Commissarerne i James Robe, og firmaet Archibald & James Robe's opbuds boe, nemlig Deherrer Isaac Du Bois & Borch Ache, maa ved proclama, sub pena præclusi et perpetui silentii, indkalde alle bekjendte eller ubekjendte Creditorer til bemeldte James Robe og firmaet Archibald & James Robe's opbuds boe, boendi i Europæiske eller Americanske Territorier, at fremkomme med deres Krav, og indlever samt bevisliggjøre deres Fordringer, personlig eller ved deres Faldaage, for benævnte opbuds Commissarier. Deherrer Isaac Du Bois og Borch Ache, forinden expirationen af den nu her bestemte tid nejlig, forinden et Aar og Sex Uger, efter at dette Proclama er blevet læst i Overretterne for Øerne St. Cruz, St. Thomas, og St. Jan, og trende paa lignende følgende Gange publiceret i "the London Gazette"; og alle saadan bekjendte eller ubekjendte Creditorer, som boe paa nogen af de Westindiske Øer eller Colonial, skal fremkomme med deres Krav og indlever samt bevisliggjøre deres Fordringer, personlig eller ved deres Fuldmægtige for benævnte opbuds Commissarier Deherrer Isaac Du Bois og Borch Ache, forinden trende maaneder fra den dato, da dette proclama er blevet læst i Øer og Underretterne paa Øerne St. Cruz, St. Thomas, og St. Jan, og efterretning derom, trende paa hinanden følgende Gange, blevet bekjendtgjort i St. Cruz Gazette. BY virtue of the authority in me vested, and in conformity with an ordinance of the 23d May, and an edict of the 12th August 1800, I do hereby make known, that in compliance with a petition delivered in, I have permitted and granted, that the Trustees in the estate of Mr. James Robe and the firm of Archibald and James Robe, viz. Messrs. Isaac Du Bois and Borch Ache, may summon by proclamation sub pena præclusi et perpetui silentii, all the known or unknown Creditors of the said trustees estate of James Robe and the firm of Archibald and James Robe, residing in European or American territories, to come forward with their demands, and to enter and prove their claims in person, or by their attorneys, before the said Trustees Messrs. Isaac Du Bois and Borch Ache, previous to the expiration of the period hereinafter limited, that is to say, within one year and six weeks from the period when this proclamation shall have been recorded in the Upper Courts of the Islands of St. Croix, St. Thomas, and St. John, and published three times consecutively in the London Gazette; and all such known or unknown Creditors as reside in any of the West India islands or colonies shall come forward with their demands, and enter and prove their claims in person, or by their attorneys, before the said Trustees Messrs. Isaac Du Bois and Borch Ache, within three months from the date of this proclamation being recorded in the Superior and Inferior Courts of the islands of St. Croix, St. Thomas, and St. John, and notice thereof being published in the St. Croix Gazette three times consecutively. And the aforesaid Trustees shall further be bound to cause this grant to be produced in the Royal and the Loan Commissioners Book-keepers Offices to the said islands, and procure a certificate of this being complied with, in failure of which this proclamation shall not be valid against any claims or prerogatives of His Majesty;
