Hereas it has been hambly represented to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that on the evening of Friday the 14th day of this instaut October, the house of Thomas Garton, situated at New Basford, in the county of Nottingham, was broken into by a number of armed men in disguise, for the purpose of murdering the said Thomas Garton; and whereas it hath been further represented to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that the armed men in question, after forcing their way into the said Thomas Garston's house, fired upon the constable and other persons, therein assembled, by which firing John Kilby, of New Basford aforesaid, was killed, and Garton, brother to the said Thomas Garton, and one of his man were wounded;

His Royal Highness, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the perpetrators of this atrocious outrage and murder, is hereby pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise His Majesty's most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person or persons who actually fired as aforesaid), who shall discover his or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
