Proposals must be made separately for each county; and each proposal must have the letter which is annexed to the tender properly filled up by two persons of known property, engaging to become bound with the party tendering, in the amount stated in the printed particulars, for the due performance of the contract; and no proposal will be noticed unless made on a printed tender, and the prices expressed in words at length; and should it so happen that during the continuance of the contract no troops should be stationed or supplied in the county, the expence of the contract and bond, paid in the first instance by the contractor, to be refunded to him by the Commissary in Chief.

**T**HE Commissioners appointed for managing the Lotteries do hereby give notice, that numbers of tickets and shares in all preceding lotteries may be examined at this Office every day, between the hours of ten and three (holidays excepted), with their registers of benefits and blanks.
