NOTICE is hereby given, that, by virtue of an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for letting to farm the Post Horse Duties," the Commissioners of Stamps, duly authorised by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, will put up the duties therein mentioned to be payable for horses, mares, and geldings, hired by the mile or stage to be used in travelling, or hired for a less period of time than twenty-eight successive days, for drawing any coach or other carriage used in travelling post or otherwise (with the exceptions therein specified), at the Crown and Anchor Tavern, in the Strand, on Wednesday the 23d day of November next, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon precisely, to be let to farm at yearly rents, for the term of three years from the 1st day of February next inclusive, in the several districts or lots following, viz.
