

presented to the States-General, demanding the 8000 Men, stipulated by the Dutch Treaty between the Crown of Spain and this State; in order to the Relief of the City of Luxembourg; and the States of Holland are Adjourned for fourteen days, without coming to any Resolution upon the said Memorial. The Count d'Avaux the French Ambassador here, has by a Memorial acquainted the States-General, that the King his Master, to manifest his desire of Peace, is willing, in case the Spaniards do within three Months, yield to him the City of Luxembourg (which his most Christian Majesty promises likewise to demolish) by a Treaty to be concluded between him and Spain, not only to renounce all his Rights and Pretensions upon Alost and other places in Flanders, but likewise all other Pretensions, without exception, which his most Christian Majesty may have upon any other Places and Countreys, of which the Crown of Spain is at present in possession.

*Marseilles, Feb. 17.* By a Bark arrived here in eight days from the coast of Barbary, we have an Account, that Admiral Herbert was before Argiers with twenty Ships, Men of War, Fireships, and Tenders.

*Paris, Jan. 20.* The 16th Instant Count Mansfeldt, Envoye Extraordinary from the Emperor, had his Audiences of Leave of the King, Queen &c. being when it returns home. The City of Luxembourg continues to be very closely blocked up.

*Whitehal, Feb. 19.* This day Edmund Saunders, Esq; Counselor at Law, and several other Gentlemen of the Middle-Temple, waited upon His Majesty, and Presented the following Declaration, Signed by the Gentlemen of the said Society. His Majesty received them very Graciously, and was pleased to Thank them for these Expressions of their Duty and Affection to the established Government.

*To the Kings most Excellent Majesty.*

Most Gracious Sovereign,

**W**E Four Majesties most Loyal and Dutifull Subjects, professing the Sandy and Pratises of Your Majesties Laws in the Society of the Middle Temple: Do with all Humility prostrate our Selves at Your Royal Feet, and conceiving our Selves, by reason of our profession more obliged then others of Your Majesties Subjects, to offer to Your Sacred Majesty our Sense of that execrable Paper, purporting the frame and form of a Traiterous Association, produced at the late Proceedings against the Earl of Shaftesbury at the Old Bailey; Do therefore Declare in our Opinion, that the same contains most gross and apparent Treasons, more manifestly tending to the ruine of Your Majesties Dominions, then the old Hypocritical Solomn League and Covenant, which they that were seduced to take, are so more bound to keep, then he that should swear to Murder his Father, is obliged to commit the Parricide. And it is most evident to us, that whatsoever promoted that Rebellious Association, designed by the said Paper, or countenanced the same, by refusing upon full Evidence to find Bills of Indictment against the Authors and Promoters thereof, and thereby as much as in them lay, preventing their being brought to a fair Tryal, have in a high measure perverted the Laws, and could have no other design thereby, then to Usurp to themselves an Arbitrary and Tyrannical Dominion, not only over our Subjects, but over Your Majesty also.

And we humbly beseech Your Majesty, favourably to accept of this reiterated Testimony of our Allegiance all of us, joyntly and severally protesting before the Almighty, that we do from our Souls Utterly Detest and Abhor that, and all other Associations whatsoever, promoted against Your Majesties Crown and Dignity. And that we will to our utmost power, endeavour to preserve Your Sacred Majesty, Your Heirs, and Lawfull Successors, from all Rebels, Traitors, and from all Conspiracies against Your Person, or most Excellent Government; and will make it our daily and hearty Prayer to the King of Kings, to Grant Your Majesty a long and prosperous Reign.

*Falmouth, Feb. 9.* On Sunday night last was cast away about a League to the Eastward of this Harbor, the Town of Nantes of Amsterdamb, Jacob Johnson Master, and the Anne and Hester of Ramsgate, both from France. By a small Vessel arrived from Scilly we have an account of four Vessels lost on that Island, with all the Goods and Men. And in Mounts-Bay two Vessels, one belonging to Dartmouth, and the other to Barnstaple, have been cast away. Yesterday came in here the Seville Meroka from Cadix, she came thence about a Month since, and confirms the taking of the Red Lyon of Argiers, by two of the Kings Frigats off of Cosfica.

*Falmouth, Feb. 13.* The 7th Instant was cast away near the Lunds-ent, a small Ketch of this place, bound for London from Bourdeaux; there were many Passengers on board her, who as well as the Seamen, were all drowned, except two Men and a Boy.

*Plymouth, Feb. 14.* His Majesties Ship the Happy Return is still here.
