

**P**ursuant to a Decree of His Majesty's Court of Exchequer at Westminster, made in a Cause Cobden against Fenner, the Creditors of John Fenner, late of West Dean, near Chichester, in the County of Sussex, Gentleman, deceased, (who died on or about the 1st day of May 1807,) are to come in, by their Solicitors, before Abel Moysey, Esq. the Deputy-Remembrancer of the said Court, at his Chambers, in the Exchequer-Office, in the Inner-Temple, London, on or before the 12th day of December instant, and prove their respective debts, or in default thereof they will be pre-emptorily excluded the benefit of the said Decree.
