

Whitehall, January 3, 1815.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to give and grant unto the Honourable Charles Stourton, son of the Right Honourable Charles Philip Lord Stourton, His Majesty's royal licence and authority, that he may take and use the surname, and bear the arms, of Langdale only, in pursuance of the last will and testament of Philip Langdale, late of Houghton, in the county of York, Esq. deceased; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Office, otherwise His Majesty's said licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to order, that the said royal concession and declaration be recorded in His Majesty's College of Arms.
