THEREAS by an Act, passed in the forty-Third year of the reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for permitting certain " goods imported into Great Britain to be secured " in warehouses without payment of duty," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the importer or importers, proprietor or proprietors, consignee or consignees of any goods, wares, and merchandise, enumerated or described in the table thereunto annexed marked (E), and which shall have been legally imported or brought into the port of Loudon, to lodge and secure in a wareliouse or warehouses, fit and proper for the reception and safe custody of such goods, wares, and merchandise, and wherein the same may be safely and securely deposited under the joint locks of the crown and the merchant, without payment, at the time of the first entry, of the duties of Customs, 'due'on the importation thereof; and whereas it is further provided by the said Act, that if the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, 'or any three of them, shall deem it expedient, that the provisions of the said Act shall be extended to any goods, wares, and merchandise, not enumerated or described in either of the tables to the said Act annexed, and shall cause a list of such goods, wares, and merchandise, to be published in the London Stazette, then and from thenceforth all and every the provisions, regulations, and restrictions of the and advantages as if they had been particularly
