To the Kings most Excellent Majesty.
May it please Your Majesty,

De Tour Majesties most Loyal, Dutisful, and Obedient Subjects, the President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Court of Assistants, and Body of the Artillery Company of Tour City of London; being truly sensible of the great Happiness which we and all others Tour Majesties Subjects enjoy, under Tour Majesties most Wise, Legal, Just, Merciful, and prosperous Government; cannot but with Horror and Amazement, look back upon the Ruine and Destruction in which your most Sacred Person, Tour Excellent Government, and these Kingdoms were lately in danger of being swallowed up, by means of an Horrid and Traiterous Conspiracy and Association; the Form and Model whereof was seized in the Closses of the Earl of Shastcsbury, by one of the Clerks of your most Honourable Privy Council.

Such an open and bare-faced Project, and Bond of Rebel'ion, as certainly the World never before saw: In which the Accuried Conspirators, have much outdone the Originals after which they Coppled: The Solemn League and Covenant, and the Holy League of France: by which (notwithstanding the Duty and Allegiance which they owe Your Majesty, Your Lawful Meirs and Successors) they swear Obedience to some of their fellow Subjects; and upon condition that they enter into, Subscribe and Swear the said Traiterous Association; by which they Covenant and Combine together by Force to Disband Your Majefties Standing Forces; a Guard which all Your Truly Loyal Subjects think fo necessary to the safety of Your Royal Person and Grown, that none can dislike them, or be terrified by them, but those who are studying and attempting the destruction of both. By which they Swear, With their jopne and particular forces to purine unto Deficuttion, all furh as upon any Title what soeber ( not Your Majesties most Sacred Person excepted ) statt oppose the Ends of this Affociation.

Now although no words can sufficiently express the Wickedness and Villany of this Conspiracy, which would (bad, it not by God's Gracious Providence, and Your Mijesties Wisdom been prevented) have deprived Tour Majesty of that Power with which God bath intrusted Tou, and Subjested Your good Subjests to the Lawless, Arbitrary, and Tyrannical Power of a handful of their Fellow-Subjests, who by force of Arms, under the specieus Pretences of securing Religion and Property, would have enslaved them; though neither the wickedness of their Designe, nor our just Detestation and Adhorrence of it tan be sufficiently expressed.

Tet we Humbly beg leave to Assure Your Majesty, that we do from our Souls Detest and Abhors this, and all other Traitezous Associations, upon what Presence soever; and shall always (as in Duty bound) be ready and chearfully willing to spends be last drop of our Blood in the Defence of Your most Sacred Person, Crown, Dignity, and Prerogative, I our Heirs, and Lawful Successors, and Tour Gevernment in Church and State, as by Lawest ablished.

TE Your Majesties most Humble and Obedient Subjects, the Subscribers hereof, being fully convinced of our Daties by Law, in manifestation of our Obedience to Your Royal Authority and Person; and of the manifold Indignities offered to Your Majesty by Insolent Libels, too likely to be improved into Treasonable Associations by Men, packt for their Fastion and Ignorance, by imitating the pattern of that late Rebellious Covenant, which wrought the Ruine of Tour Bleffed Father, and the entire Subversion both of Church and State, do look upon our Selves by our Allegiance bound in Duty to Declare our utmost Detestation of all Bands and Associations whatsoever entred into, without Tour Majesties Authority and Allowance, as Seditions Defigns against Your Sovereign Power; and more particularly, of that most abominable project of Association lately produced at the Old-Bailey, being the very Model of a change of Government, in the manifest Propo-sal of a Rebellion, under the Masque of afferting Li-berty and Religion; and the more dangerous by their falsly recommending it to the Nation, as a design of the late House of Commons, as if they intended Treafon should have been Enacted by a Law.
