To the Kings most Excellent Maj. sty.

The Humble Petition and Address of His most Dutiful Subjects, the Inhabitants of His Majelies ever Loyal Town of Brewton, in the County of Samerfet,

Humbly Sheweth,

Hat we Your Sacred Majesties most faithful Subje is, would have been earlier in our Acknow-leagments of the great Bleffings we enjoy under Tour Majesties Government (the happiest on this side Heaven') but that our Zeal was temper'd by our Fears that in the croud of Applications, much more confidera-ble for rumber iben ours, less notice would have been then of our Projessions of Thanfu fnels to God for Tour Mujesty. and to Your Majesty for Your unimitable Tenderness of Your People, in the steady prosecution of Your own Laws, and for the assurance the word of a King gives us, of Your continuance to make them Your Rule (notwithstanding the borrible Rrovocations too many had Men have given You) and to admit of no Church-Government but that by Law now established, nor of any Religion but the Protestant, one of the chief Essentials whereof, is a fixt and unshaken Loyalty. This is the Religion derived to us from our Predecessors, and which we doubt not to continue to our Posterity; that if ever Tsur Majesty should have occasion (which God of his Mercy Defend Tou from) hosh our Selves and Successors may (as our Fathers and we have done) ever chearfully hazard all for the keeping a good Conscience and our Duty to our Sovereign, which with Comfort we hope, we may motestly boast we have done, beyond the practice of most other Places; few of us but can truly fay, we have been our Selves, or Fathers, Sequestred, Imprison'd, Persecuted, Undone; and for no other crime but our Loyaty to Your Majesties Bieffed Father and Self. in whose Service every individual Man almost of us, m.y to his Glory, remember some near Relation that koneftly lest his Lif. . We have no more to add, but humbly befeech Your Majesty not to look on them as Protestants but Fesuits in Masquerade, who bring a scandal on our Nation by assuming that Name, while they endeavour to destroy our Church, and by Arbitrary Power enslave their fellow-Subjects, and calumniate Your Majesty with their awn faults: May such tender Consciences, by putting the abolfeme Laws of the Land in execution, be brought to their Duty; that Your Majesty, and all Your good Subjects may continue to enjoy the Bleffings of Peace; which under God we can attribute to nothing but Your Majesties Goodness and Prudence; for the long continuance of whose happy Reign, and lawful Successors we shall ever all and pray as becomes true I rotestants, and
