His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to appoint Sir Henry Lushington, Bart. to be His Majesty's Consul-General in the kingdom of Naples.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent hath been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to give and grant unto George Watson, of Lyssons, Holland, Llanrunny, and Houghton Court, in the island of Jamaica, Esquire, and to Anna-Susanna his wife, eldest daughter of Sir John Taylor, late of Lyssons aforesaid, Baronet, deceased, sister of Sir Simon Richard Brisset Taylor, late of the same place, Baronet, deceased, and niece of Simon Taylor, late of the aforesaid

island of Jamaica, Esquire, also deceased, His Majesty's Royal licence and permission, that they the said George Watson, and Anna-Susanna Watson, may, from grateful and affectionate respect to the memory of the said late Sir John Taylor, Baronet, Simon Taylor, Esquire, and Sir Simon Richard Brisset Taylor, Baronet, take and use the surname of Taylor; in addition to and after that of Watson; that the said George Watson, Esquire may bear the arms of Taylor quarterly with those of Watson, and that the said surname and arms may in like manner be borne by their issue, provided the said armorial ensign be first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Heralls' Office, otherwise His Majesty's said licence and permission to be void and of none effect.

And also to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to give and grant unto Major-General Sir Manley Power, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, His Majesty's royal licence and permission that he may accept and wear the insignia of an Honorary Knight Commander of the Royal Portuguese Military Order of the Tower and Sword, with which His Royal Highness the Prince Regent of Portugal has been pleased to honour him, in testimony of the high sense which that Prince entertains of the distinguished courage and signal intrepidity displayed by that Officer in several actions with the enemy in the Peninsula.
