Most Dread Sovereign,

7 E Your Majesties most obedient and faithful Subjects, not bereunto induced by Precedents of this nature Sent to Your Majelly from several Parts of your Kingdom, but out of a deep jenje of our Allegiance, and the powerful Obligations of Confeience, do in all Humi, ity lay this Application at the Feet of Tour Sacred Perfon, defiring bereby to exprefs, and publickly to declare, That we do from the bottom of our bearts detek and albor that molt wicked and Traiterous Alfociation, not long fince luckily and timely found feized on, and prevented in its Progrefs: A Confpiracy, by all truly Loyal Subjetts, ferioufly to be abominated, especially such subjects as we, who live under the Influences of the Government of a most Graunder the Influences of the Government of a molt Gra-cious, much Merciful, and the belt of Kings. A Con-fpiracy, dilguiled and vizsrded with fair Pretenfions of contriving matters for defence of Your Majelly; but, in the explicated defign and drift thereof, directly tending to the Subversion of Your Regal Power, if not to the Deltruction of Your Royal Perfon alfo. And me do hereby further defare That We do deself and to the Destruction of Tour Royal Person also. And we do bereby further declare, That We do detest and Abbor all Affociations whatfoever, not made and Warranted with Your Majesties Approbation and Concut-rences, and that we will chearfully Sacrifice our Lives and Estates for the just prefervation of Your Majelty, the Rights of the Grown in the Legal Descent, and the Religion by Law Established. And while it shall be the Good Will and Pleasure of the Almighty to continue Four Majesties Reign over us, which He Grant may be long and bappy, we shall (as in Duty bound) beartily and constantly Pray, That no Prosperity may attend these Weapons which are Forged against Tou; and that every Hand, which in any Rebellious Action [ball be beld up against your Majesty, may be withered for ever.

We the Grand Inqueft for the County of Southampton, at the Affizes held at the Caffie of Winton, the 8th day of March, 1681. have most chearfully and unanimoufly, according to our Duty, Declared this our Deteffation and Abhorrence of the deteilable Affocation, lately defigned, and which we humbly recommend to the Honourable Bench, for their Concurrence therein.

Moft Gracious and Dread Sovereign,

E Your Majesties most Loyal and Obedient Subjets, being deeply fensible of our great Obligations to Your Sacred Majesty, under whose Authority and Gracious Government we are Blest with the happy Engoyment of our Religion, Property, and all that is dear unto un; having received full Alfurances from Your Majesties frequent Declarations of Your, Royal Protestion therein; cannot but express our most frum ble Thanks for so transferdent a Favour, by Declaring our Detestiation and Abborrence of the Ingratitude, Treachary, and Fillany of those ill Man, who have used all or sty Frailises and Endeavents, to dehauch the Minds of unstable Men into Rebellion and Civil War and particularly by that project of Atlociation found amung the Papers of the Earl of Sheftesbury, and produced at the Old-Bailey; being an Act, not only of the most execrable Ingratitude, but of the foules Treason also against Your Majestics Crown and Dignity; and tending to Subversion of the established Government, both of Church and State. All which, as in Conscience, and by the Bonds of our Allegiance we are bound to Defend, So we bumbly defire to assure to us Sacred Majesty, that our Lives and Fortanes shall on all occasions be ready at Your Majestics Service, for the assure the Lineal and Lawful Succession thereof, and the Church of England, as by Law established, against ast Faltious and Rebellious Prashices, whether Populo or Phanatical whetsowr.

This being proposed to the Bench for their Concurrence, they unanimoully confented hereto.
