The Prince Regent, acting in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, Sovereign of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, has been pleased, by letters patent under the sign manual of His Royal Highness and the gret seal of the Order, bearing date the 26th day of August last, to dispense with all the statutes and regulations usually observed in regard to installation; and to grant unto His Catholic Majesty, Ferdinand the Seventh, King of Spain and the Indies, Knight of the said Most Noble Order, and duly invested with the ensigns thereof, full power and authority to exercise all rights and privileges belonging to a Knight Companion of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, as if His said Majesty had been formally installed; any decree, rule, or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.
