

half-yearly, notice is hereby given, by order of the Right Honourable the Lords and others, Commissioners for Managing the Affairs of the said Hospital, that all the out-pensioners thereof, residing in London, or within the district of the bills of mortality, are required to appear personally and regimentally, with their instructions and certificates of admission, at the Secretary's Office in the said Hospital on the respective days, and in their different classes, according to their several rates of pension, as undermentioned, when attendance will be given from nine o'clock in the morning until three in the afternoon, for the payment of a quarter of a year's pension in advance, to the 24th of December next.

*On Wednesday the 11th of October,*

The pensioners at 5d. 6d. and 8d. per day, from the different regiments of cavalry, foot guards, and infantry, including those from the militia.

*On Thursday the 12th of October,*

Those at 9d. and 10d. per day, from the different regiments, including those from the militia.

*On Friday the 13th of October,*

Those at 1s. per day, from the different regiments of cavalry, with those from the three regiments of foot guards, as also those from the 1st to the 10th regiments of foot, inclusive.

*On Saturday the 14th of October,*

Those at 1s. per day, from the 11th regiment of foot, and all the remaining regiments and corps.

*On Monday the 16th of October,*

Those at 1s. 0½d. 1s. 1d. 1s. 1½d. 1s. 2d. and 1s. 2½d. per day.

*On Tuesday the 17th of October,*

Those at 1s. 3d. 1s. 3½d. 1s. 4d. 1s. 4½d. 1s. 5d. and 1s. 5½d. per day.

*On Wednesday the 18th of October,*

Those at 1s. 6d. with those at the different rates to 2s. 1½d. per day.

*On Thursday the 19th of October,*

Those at 2s. 2d. per day, and upwards; also the pensioners from the several regiments who have been admitted on account of blindness.

It is also ordered and directed, that all out-pensioners belonging to the said Hospital, do pay particular attention to their instructions, which they are required to produce, at the time of payment, by which they are ordered to transmit to the Paymaster-General of His Majesty's Land Forces in London, their affidavits as therein prescribed, on, or immediately after every quarter-day, without which their names will not be entered on the pay-lists for the subsequent quarter, and they are not afterwards to change their place of abode, as specified in their affidavits, without unavoidable necessity, and duly notifying the same.

And that if any pensioner shall fraudulently attempt to receive a double payment of his pension, either at Chelsea, or at different places, he shall be

struck off the list, and forfeit all benefit arising from this establishment.

Orders for Payment of Prize or Bounty-Money.

Navy Pay-Office, London,  
September 30, 1815.

BY an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, it is enacted, that if any licenced agent shall insert, or cause to be inserted, in any order for payment of prize-money or bounty-money due for the services of any petty officer or seaman, &c. in His Majesty's navy, the name of any captured ship or place, the proceeds of which, or the bounty-money payable in respect whereof, shall be then in course of payment within six miles of the place where such name or names shall be inserted, and where such order shall be intended to be attested, every such person so offending shall forfeit and pay the sum of fifty pounds.

Notice is hereby given, that the above-mentioned provision of the said Act will be strictly enforced.

Revocation of a Licence.

NOTICE is hereby given, that, by virtue of the authority vested in me by an Act of Parliament, passed in the fifty-fourth year of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for regulating the payment of navy prize-money, and the transmission of accounts and payment of balances into Greenwich-Hospital," I do hereby revoke the licence granted to Mr. William Harvey, of Gloucester-Street, Portsea, on the 14th day of September 1812, to act as an agent in the receipt of pay, wages, prize and bounty-money, for and in respect of the service of petty officers, seamen, and others serving in any of His Majesty's ships; which licence is withdrawn on the grounds of having withheld prize-money which he had received for seamen, after repeated calls upon him to pay it.
