### A PROCLAMATION,

GEORGE, P. R.

WE HEREBY the Parliament shall be further  
prorogued on the said seventeenth day of January  
to Thursday the first day of February next; and  
We have given order to the Lord High Chancellor  
of that part of the United Kingdom of Great  
Britain and Ireland called Great Britain, to pre-  
pare a Commission for proroguing the same ac-  
cordingly. And We do further hereby, in the  
name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by  
and with the advice aforesaid, publish and de-  
clare, that the said Parliament shall, on the first  
day of February next, be held and sit for the dis-  
patch of divers urgent and important affairs: And  
the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights,  
Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners  
for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons,  
are hereby required and commanded to give their  
attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the  
said first day of February next.

Given at the Court at Carlton-House, the twenty-  
seventh day of November one thousand eight

hundred and fifteen, in the fifty-sixth year of  
His Majesty's reign.

GOD save the KING

BY APPOINTMENT, Under the Great Seal of Great Britain,

THOMAS BYAM MARTIN, Esq. Secretary to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent.

That day His Royal Highness the Prince Re-  
gent was pleased, in the name and on the behalf  
of His Majesty, to invest Rear-Admirals Sir Thomas  
Byam Martin and Sir Josias Rowley, both with  
the ensigns of a Knight Commander of the Most  
Honourable Military Order of the Bath, which  
Sir Thomas Byam Martin was conducted, with the usual re-  
verences, to His Royal Highness, preceded by Sir  
George Naylor (the Officer of Arms attendant upon  
the Knight Commanders); being, upon a crimson  
velvet-cushion, the star, ribband, and badge of the  
second class of the Order.

The sword of state was thereupon delivered to  
the Prince Regent, and Sir Thomas Byam Martin,  
kneeling, was knighted thereon, after which he  
had the honour to kiss His Royal Highness's hand.

Then Field-Marshal His Royal Highness the  
Duke of York, First and Principal Knight Grand  
Cross of the Order, having received from the Offi-  
cer of Arms the ribband and badge of a Knight  
Commander, presented them to the Prince Regent,  
who was pleased to invest Sir Thomas Byam Mar-  
tin with the same. The Rear-Admiral having again  
had the honour to kiss the Prince Regent's hand,  
and having received from His Royal Highness the  
star of a Knight Commander, retired.

Rear-Admiral Sir Josias Rowley was then intro-  
duced; knighted, and invested, with the same  
ceremonies.
