Navy-Office, November 20, 1815.

THE Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed money for the payment of half-pay to Sea Officers from the 30th June to the 30th September

1815, according to His Majesty's establishment in that date, there are to give notice, that the several payments will be made at the Pay Office, by the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, at ten o'clock in the morning, on the following days, viz:

On Wednesday the 29th and Thursday the 30th instant, to Admirals, Captains, and their Attorneys.

On Friday the 31st and Monday the 4th of December, to Lieutenants and their Attorneys.

On Tuesday the 5th and Wednesday the 6th, to Masters, Purrs, and Surgeons, and their Attorneys.

After which the list will be recalled the first and third Wednesday in every month, that all persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable to them, and not only bring with them the affidavit required, ~~noting~~ their not having enjoyed the benefits of any public employment either at sea or on shore; during the time they are to be paid their half-pay, but also to produce certificates that they have subscribed to the Test, and taken the Oaths of Allegiance required by Act of Parliament.

If His present Majesty stand in case any of the said Officers should not be able to attend, themselves, but employ Attorneys for that purpose, that the said Attorneys do produce the affidavits and certificates above mentioned from the persons they are employed by.

Where Officers are abroad on leave, the agents are to produce attested copies of statements before the half-pay can be paid.

And as by Act of Parliament passed in the thirty-fifth year of His present Majesty's reign intituled, "An Act for establishing more convenient expeditions Method for Payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy," it is enacted by the twentieth clause of the said Act, "that if any Commissioneer of Warrant Naval Officer who shall be entitled to receive Half-Pay, and shall be desirous to receive all the same in one sum at one meet, the value of his said pay he may apply to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, at London, to have such Half-Pay paid at or near the place of his residence, &c. in the manner pointed out by the said Act;" notice is hereby further given, that the Half-Pay owing on the 30th of September, will commence paying on the 29th instant, and all persons desirous of having their Half-Pay remitted to them may apply as above directed.
