His Royal Highness, the Prince Regent, has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to grant the dignity of a Baronet of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland unto Lieutenant-General Sir Robert Browning, Knight

Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander in Chief of the British Settlements in the Island of Ceylon, and Colonel of His Majesty's 9th Regiment of Foot, and to his heirs male of his body lawfully begotten.

LIFE ANNUITIES WITH BENEFIT OF SURVIVORSHIP.

Tontine 1790, Class 2, No. 14.

Notice to the Person entitled to the above Annuity.

Whereas in pursuance of a proposal for raising a sum not exceeding thirty thousand pounds upon the credit of the county rates, by virtue of an Act of Parliament passed in the twenty-sixth year of the reign of His present Majesty, entitled "An Act to enable the Justices of the Peace for the County of Middlesex to raise money in manner therein mentioned for erecting a House of Correction within the said County" by Tontine, in classes, at four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, with benefit of Survivorship in each respective class, Amelia Hallett, of Highgate, in the said county, widow, did subscribe the sum of two hundred pounds, in consideration that she, the said Amelia Hallett, her executors, administrators and assigns, should receive one annuity of nine pounds of lawful money of Great Britain, for and during the natural life of Amelia Marsh, daughter of John Marsh, of Colman-street, in the city of London, deceased, by Amelia Hallett, the subscriber, late Amelia Marsh, for two shares in a certain Tontine, established under and by virtue of the said Act, to be paid and payable out of the rates to be raised and levied for the public purposes of the said county, called the County Rates, by even-half yearly payments in every year, with benefit of Survivorship in that class to which such life belonged, according to the stipulations contained in the said proposal; and whereas the said Annuity afterwards became the property of Paul Horsford,
