Grant to the Army under the Command of His Grace Field-Marshal the Duke of Wellington, in the Peninsula.

Notice is hereby given, pursuant to the Act, 54th George 3, cap. 86, that the distribution of the grant made by His Royal Highness the Prince Regent to the army which served under the command of His Grace Field-Marshal the Duke of Wellington, in Portugal, Spain, and France, from the 2d May 1809 to the 10th of April 1814, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for captures taken from the enemy and appropriated to the public service, to be distributed as booty and prize according to the direction and regulation contained in the said grant, will commence and take place at No. 18, Suffolk-Street, Charing-Cross, London, as follows:

FIRST PAYMENT.

To the British army which broke up from Coimbra, in the kingdom of Portugal, on the 2d day of May 1809, and afterwards passed the Douro, to be distributed amongst the commander, officers, non-commissioned officers, and privates, who composed and were present with the army during the said operation,
