It any person shall contract with, satisfe, or say.

Light, any artificer in wood, iron, steel, brass. or other metal, clock-maker, watch-maken or any other artificer of Great Britains to go into foreign countries out of the King's dominious, and shall be convicted thereof, upon indictment or information in any of the Courts at Westminster, of at the fessues or Openter Sessions, he shall be fined are supported for the first office, and shall be imprisoned three months, and till the fine be paid. And if any person having been once convicted shall offend again, he shall be fined at the discretion of the Court, and imprisoned twelve months, and till or other metal, clock-maker, watch-maken or

"Uson complaint made, upon oath, before any Justice of Peace, that any person is endeavouring to seduce any such artificer, or that any such artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majesty dominions, for the purposes aloresaid, such Justice may send his warrant to bring the person complained of before him, or hetere some other justice; and if it shall anyear herore some other Justice; and if it shall appear by the oath of one witness, or by confession, that he was guilty of any of the said offences, such Justice may bind him to appear at the next Assizes or Quarter Sessions: And if such person shall refuse to give security, the Justice may commit him to gaol till the next Assizes or Quarter Sessions, and until he shall be delivered by due course of law. And if any such artificer shall be convicted, upon indictment, of any such promise, contract, or preparation to go beyond the seas, for the purpose aforesaid; he shall give such security to the King not to depart out of His Majesty's do-minions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till security given.

If any of the above offences shall be committed in Scotland, the same shall be prosecuted in the Court of Justiciary or the Circuits there.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to seize and seeine, hi some of Plis Mijesty's warehouses, all such tools or utensils prohibited to be exported, as such officer shall find on board any vessel not bound directly to some part in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other or the dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all tools so selved shall, after condenmation, be jublicky sold to the best bidder; and one moiety of the produce shall be to the use of His Majesty, and the other moiety to the officer who shall seize and secure the same.

If the Captain of any vessel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the said tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on board his vessel, he shall, for every such offence, forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the penalties inflicted upon persons exporting the tools; and, if the vessel belongs to His Ma-
