

Petition of a Decree of the High Court of Chancery, made in a Cause Waive against Waite, the Creditors of William Waive, late of Owen's-Piece, Goswell-Street-Road, near King's-Cross, in the County of Middlesex, Gent. (who died in the month of November 1807), are forthwith to come in and pay or their debts before Francis Paul Stratford, Esq. one of the Masters of the said Court, at his Office, in South-ampson-Buildings, Chancery-Lane, London, or in default thereof they will be excluded the benefit of the said Decree.
