

*Queen's-Palace, March 21, 1815.*

This day John Quincy Adams, Esq. Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the United States of America, had his first private audience of Her Majesty; to which he was introduced by the Earl of Morton, Her Majesty's Lord Chamberlain, and conducted by Robert Chester, Esq. Assistant-Master of the Ceremonies.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to appoint John Davidson, Esq. to be His Majesty's Consul for the town and district of New Orleans.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent hath been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to give and grant unto William Charles Falie, Esq. Post Captain in the Royal Navy, Colonel of the Portsmouth Division of His Majesty's Royal Marine Forces, and Companion of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, His Majesty's royal licence and permission that he may accept and wear the insignia of a Commander of the Royal Sicilian Order of St. Ferdinand and of Merit, which His Majesty the King of the Two Sicilies has been pleased to confer upon that Officer, in testimony of His royal regard and esteem and of the distinguished services rendered by him while commanding the British squadron (acting in co-operation with the Austrian forces) at the reduction of Gaeta; provided nevertheless, that His Majesty's said licence and permission doth not authorise, and shall not be deemed or construed to authorise, the assumption of any style, appellation, rank, precedence, or privilege appertaining unto a Knight Bachelor of these realms:

And His Royal Highness hath been further pleased to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent hath been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to give and grant unto James Campbell, Esq. Colonel in the Army, Lieutenant-Colonel of the 94th Regiment of Foot, and Companion of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, His Majesty's royal licence and authority that he may accept and wear the insignia of a Knight of the Royal Portuguese Military Order of the Tower and Sword, with which His Royal Highness the Prince Regent of Portugal has honoured him, in testimony of the high sense which that Prince entertains of the distinguished courage and intrepidity displayed by that Officer in several actions with the enemy in the Peninsula; provided nevertheless, that His Majesty's said licence and permission doth not authorise, and shall not be deemed or construed to authorise the assumption of any style, appella-

tion, rank, precedence, or privilege appertaining unto a Knight Bachelor of these realms:

And His Royal Highness hath been further pleased to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent hath been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to give and grant unto Lieutenant-Colonel Henry Watson, of the 1st Portuguese Cavalry, His Majesty's royal licence and permission that he may accept and wear the insignia of a Knight of the Royal Portuguese Military Order of the Tower and Sword, with which His Royal Highness the Prince Regent of Portugal has honoured him, in testimony of the high sense which that Prince entertains of the distinguished courage and intrepidity displayed by that Officer in several actions with the enemy in the Peninsula; provided nevertheless, that His Majesty's said licence and permission doth not authorise and shall not be deemed or construed to authorise, the assumption of any style, appellation, rank, precedence, or privilege appertaining unto a Knight Bachelor of these realms:

And His Royal Highness hath been further pleased to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.
