

by which the breach was assaulted); and his conspicuous conduct at the battles of Vittoria, the Pyrenees, and the Nivelle; His Royal Highness hath been pleased to grant unto the said Sir Hugh Gough, His Majesty's royal licence and authority that, as a lasting memorial of his faithful and zealous exertions in His Majesty's service, he and his descendants may bear the following honourable augmentation to the arms of his family, viz. "In the centre chief point pendant from a ribbon a representation of the badge of the Order of Charles the Third, and on a chief within battlements, a representation of the fortress of TARIFA, with a breach between two turrets, the British flag flying on the dexter turret;" and the crest of augmentation following, that is to say, on a wreath "A dexter arm embowed, the hand grasping the colours of His Majesty's said 87th regiment, and a French eagle depressed, the staff broken;" and in an escrol below the arms this motto "TARIFA;" provided the said armorial distinctions be first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Office, otherwise His Majesty's said licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to command, that the said royal concession and especial mark of His Majesty's favour be registered in the College of Arms.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent hath been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to give and grant unto Philip Keating Roche, Esq. Lieutenant-Colonel in the British Army, and Lieutenant-General in the Spanish Service, His royal licence and authority, that he may accept and wear the supernumerary cross of the Royal and Distinguished Order of Charles the Third, and the Order of Saint Ferdinand of the third class, with which His Catholic Majesty has been pleased to honour him, in testimony of that Sovereign's approbation of the distinguished military services rendered by him, in the field, during the Peninsular war; and that he may enjoy all the rights and privileges thereunto annexed; provided nevertheless, that His Majesty's said licence and permission, doth not authorise, and shall not be deemed or construed to authorise, the assumption of any style, appellation, rank, precedence, or privilege appertaining unto a Knight Bachelor of these realms:

And His Royal Highness hath been further pleased to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.

Whereas it hath been humbly represented unto His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that, on the night of Monday the 18th instant, some evil-disposed person or persons maliciously set fire to two stacks of wheat, the property of Mr. George Palmer, of St. Leonard's, in the parish of Town Malling, in the county of Kent;

His Royal Highness, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the atrocious act above mentioned, is hereby

pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise His Majesty's most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person who actually set fire to the said stacks of wheat), who shall discover his, her, or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further encouragement, a reward of FIFTY POUNDS is hereby offered by the said George Palmer, and a further reward of FIFTY POUNDS is also hereby offered, to be paid by the said parish of Town Malling, to any person (except as before excepted) who shall discover his, her, or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof, or to any person or persons who shall apprehend and bring the said offenders, or any of them, to conviction, or cause them, or any of them, so to be apprehended and convicted as aforesaid.
