And His Royal Highness hath been further pleased to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent hath been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to grant unto the undermentioned Officers His Majesty's royal licence and permission, that they may respectively accept and wear the insignia of a Knight of the Imperial Military Orders of Maria Theresa of Austria, of St. George of Russia of the fourth class, of the Royal Bavarian Order of Maximilian Joseph, and of an Honorary Knight Commander of the Royal Portuguese Military Order of the Tower and Sword, which their Imperial Majesties the Emperors of Austria and Russia, His Majesty the King of Bavaria, and the Prince Regent of Portugal have been pleased to confer upon them, in testimony of their approbation of the distinguished conduct and intrepidity displayed by these Officers throughout the recent arduous campaigns in the Peninsula, and at the memorable battle of Waterloo:

And His Royal Highness hath been further pleased to command, that the respective royal concessions and declarations be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.
