thereof, as may be deemed most beneficial, the remainder in fee expectant, upon the demise of the said Insolvent's mother, of and in certain messuages or dwelling-houses, lands, hereditaments and premises, situate in Blossom-Street, Henry-Street, Portugal-Street and Leigh-Street, in Manchester aforesaid, and which are particularly mentioned in the schedule of the said Insolvent, a copy of which will be produced at such meeting; and also to assent to or dissent from the said Assignee's commencing, prosecuting, or defending any suit or suits at law or in equity, for the recovery or protection of any part of the said Insolvent's estate and effects; or to the compelling, submitting to arbitration, or otherwise agreeing any matter or thing relating thereto; and on other special affairs.
