Sixthly Lurall cases in which supernumeraries, whether officers or men, shall be borne by order h, of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, they shall share with the respective ranks in or which they may be acting to a condition to the

Seventhly file following regulations to be esta-blished with respect to the share before-neu-tioned to be given to the flag officer of officers under whose command the capturing vessel

That a captain of a ship or commander of a vessel find a state of the shall have actually received some order directly from, or be acting in execution of some order issued by a garage shall be deemed to be under the command of a some order issued by a flag officer; and in the , event of his being directed to join a flag officer on any station, he shall be deemed to be under the command of such flag officer from the time when he arrives within the limits of the station, and shall be considered to continue under the command of the flag officer of such station until such captain or other commander shall have received some order directly from, or beacting in execution of some order issued by some other flag officer, or the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

That a flag officer, commander in chief, when there is but one flag officer upon service, shall have to his own use the one third part of the said three eighths of the seizures made by ships and vessels

under his command,

That when vessels under the command of several flags, which belong to separate stations, shall happen to be joint captors, the captain of each ship, shall pay one third of the share to which he is entitled to the flag officers of the station to which he belongs; but the captains of vessels under Admiralty orders, being joint captors with other vessels under a flag, shall retain the whole of their share.

That if a flag officer is sent to command in the out-ports of this kingdom, he shall have no share in the seizures made by ships or vessels which have sailed, or shall sail, from that port

by order from the Admiralty.

That when more flag officers than one serve together, the one third part of the three eighths of the scizures made by any ships or vessels of the fleet or squalion shall be divided in the following proportions, viz.

If there he but two flag officers, the chief shall have two third parts of the said third of three

eleighths, and the other shall have the remaining be more than two, the chief shall have only one half, and the other half shall be equally disided amongst the junior flag officers.

That commodores, with captains under them, shall be esteemed as flag officers, with respect to the one third of the three eighth parts of seizures made, whather commanding in chief or serving under command.

That the first captain to the admiral and commander in chief of His Majesty's fleet, and also the hist captain to a flag officer appointed, or hereefter to be appointed to command a fluet or

squadron of ten ships of the line of battle, or upwards, shall be deemed and taken to be a flag officer, and shall be entitled to a part of share of seizures, as the junior flag officer of such fleet or squadron.

Righthly-In case any difficulty shall arise in sespect to the aforementioned scheme for general astribution, not herein sufficiently provided for the same shall be referred to the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, whose direction thereupon shall be final, and have the same force and effect as if herein inserted,

-With regard to the preparations of the lists for the distribution of seizures;

Tirat the captains and commanders of His Majesty's ships and vessels of war, and of the revenue cruizers, shall, on making any scizure, transmit as soon as may be, or cause to begransmitted, to the Commissioners of the Name, or in the case of revenue cruizers, to the com-inissioners of Customs or Excise in London, Edinburgh, or Dublin, according to the department from which they may receive their pay, a ment from which they may receive then pay, a true list of the names of all the officers, samen, marines, soldiers, and others who were actually on board of His Majesty's ships or vessels of war, or the said revenue cruizers, under their command at the time of the seizure, and also those who were absent on duty as before, mentioned; which list shall contain the quality of the service of each person on board, together with the description of the men, taken from the description books of the capturing vessel or vessels, and their several ratings, and be subscribed by the captain or communiting officer, and three or more of the chief officers on boards And the Commissioners of the Navy, tor any three or more of them, or the Commissioners of the Customs or Excise in London, Edisburgh or Dublin, shall examine, on cause to be examined, such lists, by the mustersbooks de such ships and vessels of war and revenue cruizers, and lists annexed thereto, to see that such lists do agree with such muster-books, and almexed list, as to the names, qualities, or ratings of the officers, seamen, marines, soldiers and others belonging to such ships and vessels of war and revenue craizers, and upon request, shall forthwith grant a certificate, signed by any three or more of them, of the fruth of any list transmitted to them, to the agents nominated and appointed by the seizers; and also upon applica-tion to them, the said Commissioners shall give or cause to be given to the said agents, all such lists from the muster-books of any such ships of war and revenue cruizers, and annexed lists, as the said agent shall find requisite for their direction in making distribution to the parties entitled to share in the produce of such seizures, and otherwise be aiding and assisting to the said agents in all such matters as shall be necessary.
