NOTICE is hereby given, that, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Act of Parliament, fifty-fourth of His present Majesty, I do hereby revoke the licence granted to

Mr. Baruh Jonas, late of No 63, James-Street, near Mutton-Cove, Plymouth-Dock, on the 22d December 1814,

to act as an agent in the receipt of pay, wages, prize and bounty-money, for and in respect of the service of petty officers, seamen, and others serving in any of His Majesty's ships; which licence is withdrawn by me, on the ground of his having removed from his place of abode without giving me information thereof. WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifty-fourth year of the reign of His present Majesty, entitled "An Act for rebuilding the chapel of Newton, in the parish of Manchester, in the county palatine of Lancaster," it is enacted "that when the said chapel shall be rebuilt, and such seats or pews as are intended to be erected therein shall be completed, the said trustees are authorised and required to allot and appoint the several seats and pews therein to the several townships, estates and persons, who are now legally intitled by faculty or prescription, to pews or seats in the said chapel, and such pews or seats shall be made convenient to accommodate as many persons as the pews or seats which such townships or person or persons is or are now legally intitled to," notice is hereby given that the said Trustees will meet at the house of Elizabeth Beth Atkinson, the Bull's Head, in Fails-worth, in the parish of Manchester aforesaid, on Friday the 6th day of December next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, and it until two o'clock in the afternoon, for the purpose of investigating the claims of the several townships, estates and persons, who are now legally intitled in manner aforesaid, to pews or seats in the said chapel, in order that the same may be afterwards appropriated according to law; and it is requested that in the meantime the respective claimants will send a note in writing to the office of Barrett and Wilson, in Pall-Mall, Manchester, stating the nature and extent of the claims they consider themselves com-
