NOTICE is hereby given, that His Royal Highness the Prince Regent will hold a Levee at Carlton-House, on Thursday the 29th instant, at two o'clock.

AT the Court at *Carlton-House*, the 26th of April 1817,

PRESENT,

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

WHEREAS the rules and regulations of His Majesty's Order in Council of the fifth of April one thousand eight hundred and five, touching the performance of quarantine, have been understood to apply to all ships or vessels coming last from ports not declared by the said Order liable to infection, if such ships or vessels had, in the course of their voyage, previously touched at, or taken in a cargo at a port declared liable to infection: and whereas no danger to the public health is to be apprehended from a relaxation of the said rule, in respect to such of the said ships or vessels as shall arrive at any port or place in the United Kingdom, or the islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, under the circumstances and according to the provisos and conditions hereinafter expressed and contained, His Royal Highness the Prince Regent is therefore pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to order, direct, and ordain, that ships or vessels which having sailed from ports declared liable to infection, or having taken in a cargo or any goods at any port so declared liable to infection, shall afterwards have proceeded from such port to another port not declared liable to infection, and shall last sail from any such last mentioned port, and afterwards arrive from thence, either in ballast or with a cargo taken in at such port not declared liable to infection, at any port or place in the United Kingdom, or the

islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, shall not be liable to the performance of quarantine; provided the Master or Commander, or any other person having the charge of any such ship or vessel, shall declare upon oath, that all goods, wares, or merchandize enumerated in the first or second class of His Majesty's aforesaid Order of the fifth of April one thousand eight hundred and five, which may have been received on board any such ship or vessel at any port declared liable to infection, had been landed or otherwise discharged from such ship or vessel at a port not declared liable to infection, at least forty days before the arrival of such ship or vessel at any port of the United Kingdom, or the islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man; and that no plague or infectious disease prevailed on board such ship or vessel, either among the crew or passengers, at any time from the commencement of the outward voyage to the termination of the homeward voyage; and provided also, that the goods taken on board at any such port or place not declared liable to infection, shall not be of the growth, produce, or manufacture of any country declared liable to infection; or if any goods of the first class taken into such ship or vessel at such port or place not declared liable to infection, shall be of the growth, produce, or manufacture of any country declared liable to infection; then, provided proof shall be given, according to the provisions of the forty-third section of His Majesty's said Order in Council of the fifth of April one thousand eight hundred and five, that such goods have performed quarantine, either at Malta, Ancona, Venice, Messina, Leghorn, Genoa, or Marseilles.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the time being of the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the present session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to continue and extend the provisions of an Act, of the forty-ninth year of His present Majesty, for regulating the trade and commerce to and from the Cape of Good Hope, until the fifth day of July one thousand eight hundred and twenty; and also for regulating the trade of the Island of Mauritius;" His Majesty is authorised, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by any Order or Orders to be issued from time to time, to give such directions, and make such regulations touching the trade and commerce to and from all islands, colonies, or places, and the territories and dependencies thereof, to His Majesty belonging or in His possession, in Africa, or Asia to the eastward of the Cape of Good Hope (excepting only the possessions of the East India Company), as to His Majesty, in Council, shall appear most expedient and salutary, any thing contained in an Act, passed in the twelfth year of the reign of His Majesty King Charles the Second, intituled "An Act for the encouraging and increasing of shipping and navigation," or in an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King William the Third, intituled "An Act for preventing frauds, and regulating abuses in the plantation trade," or any other Act or Acts of Parliament now in force, relating to His Majesty's colonies and plantations, or any other Act or Acts of Parliament, law, usage or custom to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding: and whereas on the night of the twenty-fifth of September last, a dreadful fire broke out in the town of Port Lewis, in the Island of Mauritius, which totally destroyed the chief part of that town, together with a great mass of provisions and merchandise intended for the consumption and trade of its inhabitants, whereby a great number of families were reduced to extreme indigence, and left without a home; in consequence of which dreadful calamity the Governor of the said Island found himself compelled to open the ports of the Island to foreign vessels, in order to afford the speediest relief of which the case would admit, and thereby to save His Majesty's subjects residing in that colony from the greatest extremity of distress; and whereas it is expedient that facilities should in consequence be granted to the trade of the Island of Mauritius, for a limited time, with the view of giving still further relief to its suffering inhabitants; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that all vessels, whether British or foreign vessels belonging to countries in amity with His Majesty, arriving at any port of the Island of Mauritius, or its dependencies, within twelve months from the date of this present Order, from any country in amity with

His Majesty, laden with any articles the growth, production, or manufacture of any such country, excepting all articles composed of cotton, iron, steel, or wool of foreign manufacture, shall be permitted to enter and land their cargoes, and dispose of the same, in the said ports; provided always, that such articles, when imported in a foreign ship, shall pay a duty of two per cent. *ad valorem*, over and above what may be payable upon similar goods when imported in a British ship.

And it is further ordered, that every such vessel, arriving as aforesaid, shall be permitted to export a cargo, consisting of any articles of the growth, produce, or manufacture of the Island of Mauritius, or its dependencies, or of any other articles which shall have been legally imported there; and that all such articles so exported in foreign vessels, shall in like manner be subject to a duty of two per cent. *ad valorem*, over and above the duties (if any) which shall be payable on similar articles when exported from the Mauritius, or its dependencies, in British vessels.

It is, however, hereby further ordered and declared, that no foreign vessel, allowed by the terms of this Order to export a cargo from the Island of Mauritius, or its dependencies, shall be permitted to export such cargo to any of His Majesty's possessions. But that every British vessel which shall during the continuance of this present Order, have imported a cargo into any port of the said Island of Mauritius, or its dependencies, either from the United Kingdom, or from any other place, shall be permitted to carry back a return cargo, consisting of the articles aforesaid, to any place whatever, either belonging to His Majesty, or to any state in amity with His Majesty. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Deputy Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, for declaring His Majesty's Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act for granting to His Majesty a sum of money to be raised by lotteries.

An Act to explain and amend an Act made in the forty-eighth year of His present Majesty, for repealing the duties of assessed taxes and granting

new duties in lieu thereof, and to exempt such dwelling-houses as may be employed for the sole purpose of trade, or of lodging goods, wares, or merchandize, from the duties charged by the said Act.

An Act to amend and render more effectual four several Acts passed in the forty-eighth, forty-ninth, fifty-second, and fifty-sixth years of His present Majesty, for enabling the Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt to grant life annuities.

An Act for repealing the duties of customs on buck wheat imported into this kingdom, and for granting other duties, until the twenty-fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and twenty-one, in lieu thereof.

An Act to regulate the interests and periods of payment of navy, victualling, and transport bills.

An Act to alter and enlarge the powers of an Act passed in the fifty-fourth year of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the further improvement of the land revenue of the Crown."

An Act to extend the powers of two Acts for allowing British plantation sugar and coffee, and other articles imported into Bermuda in British ships, to be exported to America in foreign vessels, and to permit articles, the produce of America, to be imported into the said island in foreign ships, to certain other articles.

An Act to extend to Newfoundland the provisions of an Act passed in the fifty-second year of His present Majesty's reign, for permitting the exportation of wares, goods, and merchandize, from any of His Majesty's islands in the West Indies, to any other of the said islands, and to and from any of the British colonies on the Continent of America, and the said islands and colonies.

An Act for improving and maintaining the harbour of Ayr, and for regulating vessels resorting thereto.

An Act for providing an additional burial-ground for the parish of Sculcoates, in the east riding of the county of York.

An Act for amending an Act of His present Majesty, for rebuilding Newton Chapel, in the county palatine of Lancaster.

An Act to amend an Act, of the fifty-fifth year of His present Majesty, for building a new church and workhouse in the parish of Bathwick, in the county of Somerset.

An Act to enable the Company of Proprietors of the Stratford-upon-Avon Canal Navigation to raise money to discharge their debts, and to complete the said canal.
