Francfors, May 3x. Prince William of Furstemburg passed through this place yesterday in his way to strasburg. Ecom Ratisbonne we have an Account, that Monfieur Werjus, the French Envoy, had given in another Memorial to the Dyet, to dispose them to accept of the Conditions proposed by Frances But that the Emperor had by his Ministers there declared to the States, that he cannot by his Capitulation; condent to differenber the Empire, as he mult do if
