

LONDON.

At the General Session of the Peace of our Lord the King, holden for the City of London (by adjournment), at Justice-Hall, in the Old Bailey, within the Parish of Saint Sepulchre, in the Ward of Farringdon-Without, in London aforesaid, on Wednesday the 18th of February, in the Fifty-eighth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland King, Defender of the Faith, before Christopher Smith, Esq. Mayor of the City of London, Sir John Perring, Baronet, Sir Charles Flower, Baronet, Joshua Jonathan Smith, Esq. Aldermen of the said City, Sir John Silvester, Bart.
