Brussels July 3. The States of Flanders  
have sent their Deputies hither, who  
were this morning several hours with  
the Marquis de Grana to settle the  
matters proposed by his Excellency to those  
States when he was now lately in Flanders  
His Excellency has ordered the Regiment  
of Marquis Baron (which was raised  
in the time of the Prince of Parma) to  
Embark at Antwerp in order to their pas-  
sing to the Texel, where they are to go  
onboard the Men of War which were built  
at Amsterdam for the Crown of Spain,  
and lie now ready to Sail. Marquis Be-  
mer is expected here this night, having  
left the Italian Regiments which he brought  
from Luxemburg, in Gelderland: He has  
by his Excellencies order, reformed two of  
the said Regiments, and incorporated the  
Soldiers into the other two. Monsieur de  
Louvoy has been at Charlemont, Dinant  
and Maubege and is now at Lille; and  
whilst he is visiting the French Gar-  
sons on this side, his Son is visiting those  
upon the Meuse.

Brussels July 7. His Excellency has  
sent Monsieur Vanderput, Colonel of Dra-  
gons, Prisoner to Antwerp Castle, for  
refusing to obey the Governor of Leire,  
where he was in Garrison; and on this occasion  
his Excellency has declared; that all  
Colonels shall obey the Governors of the  
Places where they are in Garrison, though  
they are not generals of Battalies. The  
Deputies of Flanders are returned home,  
having adjusted all matters relating to their  
Province, very much to their Satisfaction:  
and particularly they have resolved to pro-  
vide for the Security of Newport by repair-  
ing the old Fortifications, and adding  
some new. But the States of this Province  
have not yet granted his Excellency the  
Supplies he demands of Them. His Excellen-  
cy is going to recruit all the Regiments  
of foot which he will have to consist of

1000 and 1200 Men each. Monsieur de  
Louvoy, who made a very short stay at Lille  
is returned for Paris. we have very bad  
weather here, which is like to Spoil our  
Harvest

nable Sedition and Faction (we hope beyond  
parallel,) tolerated and Justified by our  
chief Magistrats and other his adherents  
who formerly have and still do use all  
possible arts and eadeavours to frustrate  
and stifle all discoveries of Duty and  
Loyalty; yet there are many amongst us  
that with their Lives and Fortunes are,  
and ever shall be ready to defend Your  
Majesties most sacred Person and prerogative  
Your Heirs and lawfull Successors and the  
present Government both in Church and  
State, as established by law, against all  
the Enemies and Disturbers thereof of  
what Sort or demomination soever and  
shall continue our Prayers to Almighty  
God for the Preservation of Your Majesties  
most Sacred Person and for Your long and  
Prosperous Reign, and as in Duty bound  
to resolve upon all occasions to maintain  
and prove our selves
