" provinces of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, < of the articles therein coumerated, and the re" exportation thereof from such ports," it is enacted, that it slall and may be lawful, in any British-built ship or ressel, owned and navigrated according to law, or in any ship or vessel belonging to the subjects of any Sovereign or State in amity with His Majesty, to inmport into, and export from, sucls ports withits the provinces of Nova Scotia or New Brunswick, as shall be specially oppointed for that purpose, certain articles in the said Act enumerated, any thing in any law to the contrary notwithstanding; His Royal Highmess the Mrince Regent, by virtue of the powers vested in His Majesty by the above-recited Act, is pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to order, and it is; hereby ordered, that from and after the date of this Order, and duriug the contimance of the Act above recited, until further order made thereon, it shall be lawful; in any British-built slup or vessel, owned and navigated according to law, or in any ship or vessel belonging, to the sahjects of any Sovereign or State in amity with His Majesty, to import into the port of Halifax, in Nova Scotia, and the port of Saint Jolin, in New Bwnswrick, any", scantling, planks, staves, lieading-boards, shingles, hoops, hosses, neat cattle, slieep; hegs, poultry, or live stock of any sort, bread; biscuit, flour, peas, beans, potators, wheat, rice, oats; barley, or grain of any sort, pitch, tar", turyerrine, finils, seeds, and ${ }^{\prime}$ toljacco; provided thatr sucht articles shall, in all cases where the same shant be imported in foreign vessels, be ot the growth, produce, or manufacture of the conntryto which the vessels importing the same shall belong; and that it shall be lawful, in any British-built ship or vessel, owned and navigated according to law, to expont from the said ports any of the said articles either to the United Kingdom or to any other of His Majestýs possessions:

And it is bereby further ordered, that it shall and may be lawful, in any 3 3itish-built ship or vessel, oumed and navigated according to haw, or in any ship or ressel belouging to the subjects of any Sovereign oi State in anity with His Majestys to export from the ponts of Halifax, in Nova Scotia, and Saint John, in. New Brunswick, any gypsum, grind-scones, or otber produce or manifrecture of the said. prominces, and also any produce or nanufacture of the United Singdom, or of His Majesty's colonies or plantations in the West Indies, or any goods whaterer, which shall have been legally imported into the sais provinces; provided that none of the said articles shall be exponted from the parts above-named, to any foreign country or place; in any foreign vesset, unless such foreign vessel shat belont to the commery" to which the said articles slall be exported:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords

Commissioners of the Adminalty, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fortyninth year of His piesent Majesty's reign, chap. 25, intituled " An Act to permit, until the "r twelsty-fifth day of March one thousand eight " hundred and eleven, the importation of tobacco "r into Great Britain froin any place whatever," and which has been sevived and continued by sub. sequent Acts, until the twetrty-fith day of March one thousand eight hamred and nineteen, it is enacted, that it shall and may be lawful, by Oider in Council, to permit the inportation into Great Britain (as provided in' the said Act) of unmanafactured tobacco, being the produce of the East Indies, or of any of the Spanish or Portuguese colonies or plantatioiss in South America, packed in any sort of packages whatsoever, ujon such conditions, and under slich regulations and restrictions as sliall. be imposed and provided in any such Order ; and ribereas it is expedient to allow, until the tifenty-fith day of Narch wext, the imperfatith: into Great Britain of ummanofactured tobacco; being the produce of the East Indies, according to the provisions in the said Act contained; in such packages, and moder and subject to such regulations and restrictions as are hereinafter mentioned; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Priry Council, is therefore pleased, in pursuance of the said Act, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the third day of this instant August, and until the trventy-filich day of March next, any unmanufactured tobacen, being the produce of the East Indies, which shall be imported from any of the British temtories or possessions in the East Indies, according to the provisions in the said Act contained; in any British ship or vessel, amed, mavigated, and registered accorting to law, into any of the ports of Great Britain where tobacco can now hy law be inpored, may be inported and brought, packed in legal packares, or packed in bags or packazes within any hogshead, cask, chest, or case, provided every such hogshead, cask, chest, or case does not weigh less than one hundred pounds net; and provided that the master, or other person having the charge or command of the ship or vessel importing, the said tobacco, shall have on board a manifest or manifosts, content or contents, in writiog, made ont and ligned by such master or other person, in the same manmer as is directed by an Act, passed in the fify-fourth year of the reige of His present Mujesty, cap. 38 , intituled "An Act to reperline duties of Customs "payable on: gonis, wares, and mechnadies im-
