which we may believe to have been groundless, feeing we have not as yet any News of the faid Fleets being put to Sca; However the States have ordered three Men of War to go out with the four Frigats built at Amsterdam for the Crown of Spain, which are now in the Texel, to joyn the four Men of War that are already abroad, and to go and meet the said East-India Ships, if that Company thinks it necessary. The States-General having, as we have already told you, refolved to build 36 new Ship;, they of Amsterdam and Horne have begun to build those that are of their Quota. The Sieur, Perticum, the Danith Minister, will in a day or two receive an Ardwer to the Memorial he lately presented to the States, which it's believed will be ve-Ty like that which was given to the Sieur Diest, the Brandenburg Egyoy. By a Vessel arrived at Amster-dam from the West-Indies we have advice that the Subjects of this State had on the 1 oth of April laft reposses'd themselves of the Island of St. Eustache, which they abandoned in the last War; and that they found there about 800 Persons of several Nations, To Sugar-Mills, and much Cattel.

Paris, Aug. 5. The Petizion presented to the Parilament by the Doctors of the Sorbonne has had the effect they defired, for on Friday last they obtained an Arrest to take off the Prohibition the Parliament had made to those of the Faculty to meet, and the next day they held their Affembly in the usual manner. We are told that it has been fignified to the Bithops, that were of the lace Affembly of the Clergy, that the King defires they would return to their leveral Diocesses; and at the same time it is said that the three Doctors, which we told you were Banished for opposing the Regi-stering of the Kings Edict upon the late Declaration of the Clergy, will be recalled; if so, it's believed things are in a great tendency to an accommodation with the Court of Rome, from whence cour falt Letters told us that the Cardinal d'Effree had had a very long Audience of the Pape on that Subject. It is reported that the Duke of Javoy is somewhat better.

Pari, Aug 8. The fixth Instant about to at night the Dauphiness was (to the great joy of this Court) brought to bed of a young Prince, who is called Duke of Burgundy: This good news bring brought hither, was the next Morning Published to the People by the Cannon of the Bastile and the Arsenal, and the great Bells of the Town house and the Palace; and great preparations were made against the Evening, to express the publick joy on this occasion. We have advice that the five Galliots, which parted from Brest the 24th of June, passed by Cadiz on the 10th pass, to go and joyn the Fleet commanded by the Sieur du Quesne.

Buckingham, July s. At the Assess held for the County of Bucks, there was a remarkable Trial of one William Barton of Newport-Pagnel Shoemaker, a person very notorious, having not song before been Tried for bu Life for Felony in this County, and escaped very narrows, who after the Bledion of the last Parliament that sate at London, gave out a false and scandatous report of Sir Richard Temple, chosen a Member for this place. That he was a Papist, and that he had seen him at Mass at Mr. Digby's at Gothurst see veral times, many years since, when he the said Barton that became a mercenary Convert of Mt. Digby's to the Popish Religion. Whereupon In Richard Temple trought his Adison of Segudal against

the said Barton, for the Words, and had 500 Pounds Damage given him: But at the Intercession of several Gentlemen, in compassion to the Powerty of his Wife and Family, did not take out Execution. But when, after several Prorogations, that Parliament met, the said Barton did not only come up as a Witness to the Committee of Priviledges, but prevailed with a Popish Wench of about 18 years of age, to come up for the same purpose, against whom also Sir Richard Temple bath since recovered 500 Pounds Damages, and found at bis return into the Countrey, that the faid Barton had been Suborning several Persons to swear against him, parti-cularly one Michael Cutlet of Olney, upon whose Te-stimony, and of two more credible Witnesses, a Bill of Indiament for Subornation of Perjury was found a-gainst the laid Barton. And fince, at the last Affi-zes at Allesbury, a Bill of Indiament was found against John Forty, Bailiff of the Liberty of Hanslope: The former of which Indiaments coming to Trial, the subornation was clearly promed by several credible Witnesse see [although the field Cutlet were dead] against the said Barton; as also against the said Forty (who was admitted as a Witness for the said Barton, for mant of Process:) Whereupon the Jury found the faid Barçon Guilty, and Sentence was given by the Lord Chief Barron, That he should be tined 20 Mark, and be committed until he paid the fame; and that he should fland with his Head in the Pillory in Ailesbury-Market, on the fourth of November next, with this Inscription upon it, FOR SUBORNATION OF PERJURY. And the faid Forty being then in

Court, was also compelled to Plead to bis Inditiment.
