WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that, on the night of Sunday the 10th instant, some evil-disposed person or persons did maliciously and wilfully kill and destroy two sheep and one lamb, which were grazing in a small close on the South side of Barrowby Turnpike Gate, in the parish of Barrowby, in the county of Lincoln, and four ewes in lamb, which were grazing in a great grass close near the abovementioned place, all the property of the Reverend Jonathan Kendal; one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace in and for the parts of Kesteven, in the said county; and that the said offence was committed not for plunder, but from a principle of revenge to the said Mr. Kendal, who is a very active Magistrate for the said parts; His Royal Highness, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the said felony, is hereby pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise His Majesty's most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person who actually committed the same) who shall discover his, her, or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
