Bruffelsy Sept. 2. The most Christian King has fent Orders to his Intendants in the new Conquelts in Flanders; as likewife in Burgundy, to cake off the Confifcations which the Spanih Ellates are under, and to reftore the Moneys they have receivod, which is performing accordingly. Don Mar-sin de los Rios is preparing for his journey to Vienna, whicher he is font to Compliment the Emperor upon the Birth of the last Arch-Duke, and carries a Prefent from the King of Spain to the value of 100200 Crowns. We have Lettens from Am-flerdam which tell us, That by a Ship argived in 13 days from Cadiz, they were affured that the Galcons arrived there the day before the faid Ship came from thence, which we shall be glad so have the Confirmation of, because of the importance it is of to these Countreys, his Excellency having been promifed a Supply of a Million of Crowns upon the aprival of that Fleet. We are told plat his Excellency intends to furtific Ejlvord, in order whereunto he has been there with feveral Ingeniers to view the place) and has recommended it to the States of this Province to make an Effumate of the Charge. We have feen a Comet here for feveral Nights paft, in the N. W. the Isil of it pointing Northwards: It rifes about 9 a Clock, and was very visible last nights

Hague, Aug. \pm 8. OH Tuefday laft the French Ambaffador made a great Extertainment, which was accompanied with Fire-works, $\Im \sigma$, for the Birth of the Duke of Burgundy-i His Excellency invited the States of Holland, but they excufed themlelves, for that they were to Reparate for fome time; all the Forreigd Ministers here were likewife invited, except the Imperial and Swedilh Ministers, the first being omitted because of some dispute about place, and the other for that he did not give any notification to the French Ambaffador of the Birth of the Prince of Sweden, A Comet or Blazing-Star has been feet here for Aeveral nights path in the N.W. Falmouth, Aug. 21. On Thurfday laft came into this Port His Majeftics Ship the *Centurion*, with 12 OF-14 Merchant Ships, bound for *Newfoundland*; we expected likewife the *Woolwich*, and the reft of the Fleef, but the Wind, which was at S. E. not plowing fo hard as it did the night before, they kept at Sea. and the next day the Wind coming N. N.
