A T the Court at Carlton-House, the 17th of September 1819,

PRESENT.

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

THereas by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled " An Act to " enable His Majesty to direct the distribution of " any reward awarded by the Commissioners of " the Customs or Excise to the Officers of the " Army, Navy, or Marines, for apprehending " smugglers, in such manner as His Majesty shall " be pleased to appoint," reciting, that by the laws now in force for the prevention of smuggling, it is lawful for the Commissioners of Customs or Excise in England, Scotland, and Ireland respectively, and they are thereby required, in certain cases, to award, to every Officer or other person arresting any person for breach of those laws, so that he shall be convicted or committed to prison on account thereof, any sum not exceeding twentypounds for each man so convicted or committed to prison; and that it is expedient that His Majesty should be empowered, in certain cases, to direct the distribution of such reward, by His Order or Orders in Council, or by His Royal Proclamation in that behalf, in such manner as He shall be pleased thereby to appoint; and, therefore, enacting that in all cases wherein the Commissioners of the Customs or Excise of England, Scotland, and Ireland respectively, shall award any sum not exceeding twenty pounds as aforesaid to any Officer or Officers, non-commissioned Officers, petty Officers, seamen or privates of His Majesty's Army,

Navy, or Marines, or acting under the Orders of the Lord High Admiral, or of the Commissioners for executing the office of the Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, for any person so arrested, convicted, or committed to prison as aforesaid, the same shall be divided and distributed in such proportions, and according to such rules, regulations, and Orders as His Majesty shall, by His Order or Orders in Council, or by His Royal Proclamation in that behalf, be pleased to direct and appoint.

In pursuance of the powers so vested in His Majesty, His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, is pleased to Order, and it is hereby Ordered, that the bounty money, awarded for the arrest of any person or persons, arrested, convicted, and committed to prison, according to the provisions of the laws above recited, by any Officer or Officers, noncommissioned Officers, petty Officers, seamen or privates of His Majesty's Army, Navy, or Marines, or acting under the Orders of the Lord High Admiral, or of the Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, shall be divided and distributed amongst such Officers, non-commissioned Officers, petty Officers, seamon or privates of His Majesty's Army, Navy, or Marines, or acting under the Orders of the Lord High Admiral, or of the Commissioners for executing the office of the Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland as aforesaid, according to the rules and regulations directed and provided by His Majesty's Order in Council of the fourteenth of October one thousand eight hundred and sixteen, for the distribution of the shares of any such seizures, as are or shall, by virtue of any Acts relating to the trade and revenues of His Majesty's dominions, be payable to and amongst the Commanders, Officers and crews of any of His Majesty's ships or vessels of war.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to cause His Royal Highness's pleasure, hereby signified, to be duly complied with.

T is this day ordered by His Royal Highness the Prince Regent in Council, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, that the Parliament, which stands prorogued to Tuesday the twenty-fourth day of August next, be further prorogued to Tuesday the 2d day of November next.

Mayor, the Aldermen, Recorder, Sheriffs, Common Council, and Officers of the City of London, waited upon His Royal Highness the Prince Regent with the following Address and Petition; which was read by Sir John Silvester, Bart. the Recorder:

To His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, REGENT of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

The humble Address and Petition of the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London, in Common Council assembled.

May it please your Royal Highness,

WE, His Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London, in Common Council assembled, humbly approach your Royal Highness with feelings of the most serious alarm and regret at the extraordinary and calamitous proceedings which have recently taken place at Manchester.

We humbly represent to your Royal Highness that, under the free principles of the British Constitution, it is the undoubted right of Englishmen to assemble together for the purpose of deliberating upon public grievances, as well as on the legal and constitutional means of obtaining redress.

That for the exercise of this right a meeting was held at Manchester on the 16th August last, and without entering into the policy or prudence of

convening such assembly, it appears to us, from the information which has transpired, that the said meeting was legally assembled, that its proceedings were conducted in an orderly and peaceable manuer, and that the people composing it were therefore acting under the sauction of the laws, and entitled to the protection of the Magistrates.

We have nevertheless learnt with grief and astonishment, that while the meeting was so assembled, and when no act of riot or tunult had taken place, the Magistrates issued their warrants for the apprehension of certain persons then present, for the execution of which, although no resistance was made on the part of the people, or those against whom the warrants were issued, they immediately resorted to the aid of the military, when, without any previous warning of their intention, the Manchester Yeomanry Cavalry suddenly rushing forward opened a passage through the multitude, furiously attacking by force of arms peaceable and unoffending citizens, whereby great numbers of men, women, and children, and even peace officers were indiscriminately and wantonly rode over and many inhumanly sabred and killed.

We feel ourselves called upon to express to your Royal Highness our strongest indignation at these unprovoked and intemperate proceedings which we cannot but view as highly disgraceful to the character of Englishmen, and a daring violation of the British Constitution.

That from your Royal Highness's known and declared attachment to the Constitution and the Laws, we feel the most decided conviction that your Royal Highness never could have been induced to express your approval of the conduct of the abettors and perpetrators of these atrocities had not your royal confidence been abused by interested and misrepresented statements of these illegal and fatal transactions.

We humbly submit to your Highness, that at a time when the great body of His Majesty's subjects are suffering under the severest privations, however erroneous may be their ideas as to the means of redress, a kind and conciliating attention to their complaints is equally called for by policy and justice, and that depriving them of the means of expressing their grievances by cruelty and despotism can only tend to increase the present discontents, destroy public confidence in the pure and equal administration of justice, excite disaffection, and lead to acts of open violence or secret revenge.

We therefore humbly pray that in order to avert these calamities; to maintain the authority of the law; and to protect the lives and liberties of the subject, your Royal Highness will be graciously pleased to institute an immediate and effectual inquiry into the outrages that have been committed, and cause the guilty perpetrators thereof to be brought to signal and condign punishment.

To which Address and Petition His Royal Highness was pleased to return the following Answer:

" I receive with feelings of deep regret this

· Address and Petition of the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the city of London, in

Common Council assembled."

"At a time when ill designing and turbulent men are actively engaged in inflaming the minds of their fellow subjects, and in endeavouring by means the most daring and insidious to alienate them from their ellegiance to His Majesty and the established Constitution of the Realm, it is on the vigilance and conduct of the Magistrates that the preservation of the public tranquillity must in a great degree depend; and a firm, faithful, and active discharge of their duty cannot but give them the strongest claim to the support and approbation of their Sovereign and their Country."

" With the circumstances that preceded the late meeting at Manchester you must be unacquainted, and of those which attended it you appear to have

been incorrectly informed."

" It however the laws were really violated on that occasion by those to whom it immediately belonged to assist in the execution of them, the tribunals of this country are open to afford redress; but to institute an extrajudicial inquiry under such circumstances as the present would be manifestly inconsistent with the clearest principles of public justice."

This day the Baron de Strierneld, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Sweden, had a private audience of the Prince Regent, to deliver a letter from his Sovereign; to which he was introduced by Lord Viscount Castlereagh, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Robert Chester, Knt. Master of the Ceremonics.

Carlton-House, September 16, 1819.

This day His Royal Highness the Prince Regent was pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to invest Rear-Admiral the Honourable Sir Henry Blackwood, Bart, and Rear Admiral Sir John-Poo Beresford, Bart. with the ensigns of a Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath.

By command of the Prince Regent, Rear-Admiral the Honourable Sir Henry Blackwood was conducted, with the usual reverences, to His Royal Highness, preceded by Sir George Nayler (the Officer of Arms attendant upon the Knights Commanders), hearing upon a crimson velvet cushion the star, ribband, and badge of the second class of

the Order.

The sword of state was thereupon delivered to the Prince Regent, and Sir Henry Blackwood was bnighted therewith, after which he had the honour

to kiss His Royal Highness's hand

Then His Royal Highness the Duke of York and of Albany, First and Principal Knight Grand Cross of the Order, having received from the Officer of Arms the ribband and badge of a Knight Com-mander, presented them to the Prince Regent, who

was pleased to invest Sir Henry Blackwood with the same.

The Rear-Admiral having again had the honour to kiss the Prince Regent's hand, and having received from His Royal Highness the star of a Knight Commander, retired.

Rear-Admiral Sir John-Poo Beresford, Bart. was then introduced and invested, with the same ceremonies, but was not knighted upon this occasion, having formerly received that honour.


