POST HORSE DUTIES.

Stamp-Office, London, October 24, 1820.

NOTICE is hereby given, that, by virtue of an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to continue, until the thirty-first day of January one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four, an Act of the fifty-seventh year of His late Majesty, for letting to farm the Post Horse Duties, and to amend the Acts relating to the Post Horse Duties," the Commissioners of Stamps will put up the duties therein mentioned to be payable for horses, mares, and geldings, hired by the mile or stage to be used in travelling, or hired for a less period of time than twenty-eight successive days (with the exceptions therein specified), at the *Crown and Anchor Tavern, in the Strand*, on Friday the 24th day of November next, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon precisely, to be let to farm at yearly rents, for the term of three years from the 1st day of February next inclusive, in the several districts or lots following, viz.
