IN pursuance of an Act of Parliament made and passed in the thirty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for dividing and inclosing the open and common fields, commons and waste lands, in the parish of Caddington, in the counties of Bedford and Hertford;" and in compliance and by virtue of the powers and directions therein contained, I, the undersigned John Pridden, Vicar of the said parish of Caddington, do hereby give notice that I intend to apply at the Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be held in and for the county of Bedford, in the week after the close of the feast of Easter, now next ensuing, being the first Quarter Sessions of the Peace in the week after the close of the feast of Easter next, after the expiration of twenty-one years after the making the award of the Commissioners named in the said Act of Parliament, that two persons may be named and appointed by the Justices then and there assembled to be, together with a third person to be named and chosen by such two persons, arbitrators or referees for inquiring into and ascertaining, by means of the London Gazette; the average price of a Win-
