

Pursuant to an Order of the High Court of Chancery, made in a Cause of Jones against Bromley, the Creditors of Randle Jones, late of Blue-Gate-Fields, in the Parish of St. George in the East, in the County of Middlesex, Victualler (who died in the year 1817), are forthwith to come in and prove their debts before John Springett Harvey, Esq. one of the Masters of the said Court, at his Chambers, in Southampton-Buildings, Chancery-Lane, London, or in default thereof they will be excluded the benefit of the said Order.
