

Kent, Captain in His Majesty's Royal Navy, on half-pay, and late a prisoner in the King's-Bench Prison, and discharged therefrom by virtue of an Act, made and passed in the 53d year of the reign of His late Majesty, King George the Third, intituled "An Act for the Relief of Insolvent Debtors in England," that the Assignees of the estate and effects of the said Insolvent intend to meet on Monday the 16th day of September next, at Eleven o'Clock in the Forenoon, at the Bell Inn, in Sandwich aforesaid, to make a further dividend of the said John Bradly's estate and effects amongst all the Creditors of the said Insolvent, from whose demands he hath obtained his discharge, in proportion to the just debts due to such Creditors respectively; and at which meeting the said Creditors are desired to attend, in order to assent to or dissent from the said Assignees selling or disposing of, by public auction or by private contract, and either together or in parcels, and at such times as they may consider most advantageous, all such parts, purparts, or shares, right, or interest of the said Insolvent, of and in certain real and personal estates and effects, late the property of William Wyborn Bradly, his late father, deceased, and also to authorise and

empower the said Assignees to join and concur with all or any of the owners or proprietors of the other parts, purparts, or shares thereof, in the sale or disposition of all or any part of the same estates and effects, in such manner, and at such times as may be deemed most proper, and to join in all necessary conveyances, assignment, or other assurances in the law, to the purchaser or purchasers thereof for the purpose of completing any such sale or sales, and that in case any such sale or sales cannot be effected then that the said Assignees may convey and assure all the right and equity of redemption in the said parts and shares of the said Insolvent, of and in the said estate and effects unto the mortgagees thereof, in full satisfaction and discharge of all principal, money, interest, and expences, due upon or in respect of the mortgage thereof; and also to assent to or dissent from the allowance of the said Assignees' accounts and payments as exhibited at the dividend meeting holden on the 21st day of January last; and generally to authorise and empower the said Assignees to take such steps and pursue such measures from time to time, in and about the said Insolvent's affairs as by them in their discretion may be deemed expedient and proper.
