HEREAS the time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the eighteenth of May last, for prohibiting the exportation of gunpowder, arms, or ammunition, to the places therein specified, will expire on the thirtieth day of this instant November; and whereas it is expedient, that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer; His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's service) do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the thirtieth day of this instant November), presume to transport any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place within the dominions of the King of Spain, or to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar), or in the West Indies, or on any part of the Continent of America (except to a port or place, or ports or places in His Majesty's terricories or possessions on the Continent of North America, or in the territories of the United States of America), or ship or lade any gun-powde, or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammuni.

tion, on board any ship or vessel, in order to transporting the same into any such ports or places withia the dominions of the King of Spain, or into any such port or place on the Coast of Africa (except as above excepted), or in the West Indies, or on the Continent of America (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Second, intituled " An Act to empower His " Majesty to prohibit the exportation of gun-" powder, or any sort of arms or ammunition, " and also to empower His Majesty to restrain " the carrying coastwise of salt-petre, gun-powder, " or any sort of arms or ammunition;" and also by an Act, passed in the thirty-third year of His late Majesty's reign, cap. 2, intituled "An Act to " enable His Majesty to restrain the exportation " of naval stores, and more effectually to prevent " the exportation of salt-petre, arms, and ammu-" nition, when prohibited by Proclamation or ' Order in Council;"

THE SOVEREIGN.

The Sovereign and the Knights Companions being seated, the Chancellor, standing in his place on the left hand of His Majesty, signified to the Chapter the Sovereign's royal will and pleasure, that the vacant stall in the Royal Chapel of Saint George at Windsor be filled.

The suffrages were thereupon collected by the Chancellor (beginning with the Junior Knight Companion), and, by him, presented to the Sovereign, who was pleased to command his Lordship to declare, and he accordingly declared, that the Most Honourable Francis-Charles Marquess of Hertford had been duly elected a Knight of the Most

Then, by the Sovereign's command, the Mar-

quess (being already a Knight) was received at the door of the Chapter-Room by the Marquess of Anglescy and Earl Bathurst, the two Junior Knights Companions present, and conducted between them to His Majesty, preceded by Garter, carrying the ensigns of the Order upon a crimson vervet cushion, and by Black Rod.

The Marquess of Hertford, kneeling near the Sovereign, and Garter presenting, on his knee, the Garter, His Majesty, assisted by His Royal Highness the Duke of York and His Royal Highness the Duke of Clarence, the two Senior Knights Companions present, buckled it on his Lordship's left leg; the Chancellor pronouncing the usual admonition.

Garter next presented the ribband with the George; and His Majesty, with the assistance of the atoresaid two Senior Knights Companions, put the same over the Marquess's left shoulder; the Chancellor pronouncing the admonition.

The Marquess, having kissed the Sovereign's hand, and received the congratulations of each of the Knights Companions, withdrew.

The Chapter being ended, Garter, by command of the Sovereign, called over the Knights Companions, and a procession was made back to the private apartment of His Majesty, in the order as before.

EXCHEQUER BILLS.

And whereas the proper flags, which by the said Proclamation the ships and vessels of His Majesty s subjects are authorized to wear, are not sufficient to enable them to make signals without the addition of some other colors;

We do further warrant and authorize all His. Majesty's subjects to hoist on board their ships and vessels, by way of signal only, any colors (except pendants and the Union Jack), provided such colors shall not be hoisted in the place where similar colours are usually worn in His Majesty's ships and vessels :

And whereas it has been represented to us that certain signals have been heretofore established and agreed upon, and are now in use amongst His Majesty's subjects, wherein pendants and the Union Jack are employed, and that it would be inexpedient to prohibit the use of the said signals, until reasonable time for substituting some other description of colors in lieu of pendants and the Union Jack be allowed;

We do further warrant and authorise all His Majesty's subjects to hoist and use, for signals only, pendants and the Union Jack, until the 1st of January 1824 and no longer; upon and after which day no pendant is under any pretence whatsoever to he hoisted in the ships or vessels of any of His Majesty's subjects, nor the Union Jack, except only, as before provided, as the signal for a pilot.
